	<p>Gideon (fleece wet, dry), Abimelech (anti-judge), Tola, Jair, Jephthah, Ibzan, Elon, Abdon, Samson (riddle and bride, Delilah)</p> <p>--Epilogue: Religious and moral disorder (17-21)</p> <p>* Two episodes (!)</p>		
1 Samuel	<p>Setting up and establishing the monarchy & Saul’s reign</p> <p>--Historical setting (1-7)</p> <p>* Eli, Hannah (pre-Magnificat), Samuel, Eli’s sons, famous “call”, Ark taken and restored (rats and tumors)</p> <p>--Samuel establishes Saul as king (8-12)</p> <p>* People request a king (Dt 17:14-20), Saul anointed privately and chosen publicly, confirmed with victory, inaugurated and covenant renewed</p> <p>--Saul a failure as king (13-15)</p> <p>* Jonathan</p> <p>--Saul’s reign deteriorates and David rises to the throne (16:1-31:13)</p> <p>* Shepherd-boy David anointed, in service to Saul, harp playing, kills Goliath, friends with Jonathan, pursuit and sparing, witch of Endor, Saul’s defeat, Jonathan’s death, and Saul’s suicide</p>	1050 B.C.-1010 B.C.
